## POSTOPERATIVE RESTRICTIONS (FOR ONE WEEK)

- Do not rub the eye and sleep with the protective eye shield
- No water directly into eye and no swimming
- No lifting more than 15 pounds
- No high impact activities (light aerobics are okay such as stationary bike)
- Avoid getting dust, dirt, debris, and makeup in the eye

## **POSTOPERATIVE INSTRUCTIONS**

- The vision may be foggy the first few days and gradually improve
- The following symptoms are normal the first few weeks following surgery:
  - » Scratchy or achy feeling
  - » Few black "shadows"
  - » Sensitivity to light
- For additional comfort, you may use over the counter Tylenol or Advil, take according to directions on the bottle and your personal physician
- It is okay to remain on your usual eye drops (artificial tears, glaucoma medicine, etc)
- It is okay to read and watch TV

During overnight and weekend hours you will be directed to our voicemail system, please dial 0 during the prompt and you will be transferred to the doctor. If you cannot get in touch with the doctor, then go to the nearest ER.

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
